■ A town meeting was held

Thursday to address concerns with the project to clean up Spelter area homes and property. The cleanup program is a part of a class action settlement with DuPont.

The public hearing came in response to residents' concerns. As a result of the hearing, the remediation company will finish the cleanup projects it already has underway before starting with any additional homes, said Ed Gentle, the lawsuit claims administrator.

Some of the concerns have been about dust and mud, Gentle said.

The settlement office now plans to have town meetings each week, Gentle added. The next one is set for 6:30 p.m. Wednesday.

The remediation is

designed to address potentially toxic levels of arsenic, cadmium and lead in the soil and inside homes located close to the old Spelter smelter.

Separately, the settlement provides for medical monitoring.
